ABOUT KINSHIP'S #ValueOurLove CAMPAIGN



We've launched our first major campaign - **#ValueOurLove** - to highlight the crippling lack of support available for kinship families.

Every child needs love. Love gives children certainty; love reduces stress, anxiety and fear; love allows children to concentrate on schoolwork and build friendships; love grows confidence, self-esteem and happiness. Love means commitment to children, being there for them and supporting them as long as they need it. That is why children do better when they are kept within their families.

162,000 children in kinship families across England and Wales know

the value of love. But politicians still overlook kinship families and undervalue the role of kinship carers in keeping children out of the care system.

Unlike children in foster care, most kinship families receive no financial or practical support - 8 in 10 kinship carers aren't getting crucial local authority support, which risks the futures of thousands of children.

WHAT WE WANT:

We're calling on the Government to value kinship carers' love and commit to a first ever kinship care strategy which includes these four urgent changes so that kinship families are entitled to the same support as foster and adoptive families: We need to:

- **1** Equalise allowances between foster and kinship families.
- 2 Equalise access to training and support between kinship carers and foster carers.
- 3 Equalise leave between adoptive and kinship families.
- 4 Equalise support between children in kinship care and those in care.

We are supporting you as kinship carers to lobby the Government, your MPs and your local authorities.
